## **How to Knit Socks Three Methods Made Easy**

- Two circular needles in the size recommended for your yarn
- Sock yarn
- Scissors
- Tapestry needle
- 1. Cast on the number of stitches required for your foot circumference.
- 2. Knit in the round until the sock reaches the desired length.
- 3. **Begin the heel flap.** Knit the number of stitches required for the heel flap width.
- 4. **Turn the work and knit back and forth in rows.** Knit until the heel flap reaches the desired length.
- 5. **Begin the heel turn.** Turn the work and knit the first stitch. Slip the next stitch purlwise. Turn the work and knit the first stitch. Slip the next stitch purlwise. Repeat this process until all of the stitches on the needle have been turned.
- 6. Knit in the round until the sock reaches the desired height.
- 7. **Begin the toe.** Knit the number of stitches required for the toe width.
- 8. **Turn the work and knit back and forth in rows.** Knit until the toe reaches the desired length.
- 9. **Begin the toe decreases.** Knit two stitches together, knit one stitch, slip one stitch, knit one stitch, pass the slipped stitch over the knitted

stitch. Repeat this process until all of the stitches have been decreased.

- 10. Cut the yarn and pull it through the remaining stitches.
- 11. Weave in any loose ends.
  - One circular needle in the size recommended for your yarn
  - Sock yarn
  - Scissors
  - Tapestry needle
  - 1. Cast on the number of stitches required for your foot circumference.
- 2. Join the stitches in the round using the magic loop method.
- 3. Knit in the round until the sock reaches the desired length.
- 4. **Begin the heel flap.** Knit the number of stitches required for the heel flap width.
- 5. Divide the stitches in half. Knit the first half of the stitches in the round. Turn the work and knit the second half of the stitches in the round. Repeat this process until the heel flap reaches the desired length.
- 6. **Begin the heel turn.** Turn the work and knit the first stitch. Slip the next stitch purlwise. Turn the work and knit the first stitch. Slip the next stitch purlwise. Repeat this process until all of the stitches on the needle have been turned.

- 7. Knit in the round until the sock reaches the desired height.
- 8. **Begin the toe.** Knit the number of stitches required for the toe width.
- 9. **Divide the stitches in half.** Knit the first half of the stitches in the round. Turn the work and knit the second half of the stitches in the round. Repeat this process until the toe reaches the desired length.
- 10. Begin the toe decreases. Knit two stitches together, knit one stitch, slip one stitch, knit one stitch, pass the slipped stitch over the knitted stitch. Repeat this process until all of the stitches have been decreased.
- 11. Cut the yarn and pull it through the remaining stitches.
- 12. Weave in any loose ends.
  - Four double pointed needles in the size recommended for your yarn
  - Sock yarn
  - Scissors
  - Tapestry needle
  - 1. Cast on the number of stitches required for your foot circumference.
  - 2. Divide the stitches evenly among the four needles.
  - 3. Knit in the round until the sock reaches the desired length.
  - 4. **Begin the heel flap.** Knit the number of stitches required for the heel flap width on two of the needles. Turn the work and knit back and forth

- in rows on the other two needles. Repeat this process until the heel flap reaches the desired length.
- 5. **Begin the heel turn.** Turn the work and knit the first stitch. Slip the next stitch purlwise. Turn the work and knit the first stitch. Slip the next stitch purlwise. Repeat this process until all of the stitches on the needle have been turned.
- 6. Knit in the round until the sock reaches the desired height.
- 7. **Begin the toe.** Knit the number of stitches required for the toe width on two of the needles. Turn the work and knit back and forth in

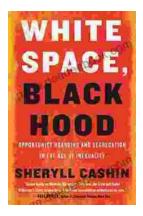
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
